

Pastor's PenLiving through UncertaintyFebruary 2022

Protection of the LORD be with you!

Do you remember February 2020? It was then that COVID-19 landed on the US continent and started producing positive cases. From then to now, we've been practicing how to live with uncertainty for two years. In the absence of its vaccine, many people had a fear of this unknown and dreadful virus. The world economy froze, supplies of daily necessities were delayed, and even grocery stores were almost empty.

When various vaccines were developed, people started to be vaccinated and we soon anticipated the end of this pandemic, variations such as Delta and current Omicron that exceed human responsiveness have shattered our expectations. Are you yet optimistic about the future?

Of course, someday this will end. But as each of us has various experiences and perceptions, the way we view the future will also vary. As your pastor, my concern is not about our future but our today, saying that our sense of community and solidarity could have been weakened amid recurring uncertainties.

Thankfully, our church has continued our mission despite the hardships of the past two years. With God's help, our own determination and practice made us survive. But on the other hand, our performance may have been constrained to the extent that we feel safe. Therefore, the challenge we need to live with endless uncertainty is to go beyond our safety line to encourage each other and continue our connection.

With this said, let me bring some spiritual insight from the Bible regarding it. The Bible offers a variety of spiritual reflections through 45 different references to the plague/pest. Among them, I want to talk about uplifting the spiritual experience of God who protects us through the plague.

"[H]is faithfulness is a shield and buckler. You will not fear ... **the pestilence** that stalks in darkness, or the destruction that wastes at noonday." (Psalm 91:4-6 NRSV)

The Bible does not say that there will be no epidemics. Instead, it says we will not be afraid of the pestilence. Because God's faithfulness is our shield. This is a different matter than taking action to protect each of us and each other. So, let's have a heart to trust in God. And let's encourage each other to say this.

"My refuge and my fortress; my God, in whom I trust." (Psalm 91:2, NRSV)

It is not a great thing to practice peace when everything is okay. But trusting God and practicing peace in the midst of uncertainty is pleasing to God. We never know when this pandemic may recede, so we must not stop encouraging and uplifting ourselves as Christians.

And let us keep our faithfulness before God.

Finding God in a bag of Groceries by Laura Lapins Willis

"If you have wondered about how you know what a good next step is, about how you find a place in God's church: if you have wondered about the ways selfknowledge intertwines with knowledge of God, read this book." Lauren Winner

We travel with Laura Willis as she seeks her own ministry among bags of groceries as a director of a food pantry. The encounters with the clients of the food pantry are moving, Here are a few quotes from the book "Jesus is in the messiest place of our lives. And Jesus calls us to love those places where He comes to us even when we don't think we can do it."

"Contemplative prayer reminds us If we don't have the answers to our questions maybe we should be quiet and listen--listen to our intuition; listen to our heart ,listen to God. If we aren't getting answers to the questions we are asking, we might need to ask different questions. Above all we need God's grace."

"While I was searching for an answer to my vocational questions, I realized my work was right in front of me; to be Christ for others and to let them be Christ for me; to understand that following God's calling begins with recognizing my own need for nourishment, for healing and for help -- my own hunger for food from the hands of Christ."

At our January 12, 2022 meeting of Olive Branch UMW we held our annual Special Program - A call to Prayer and Self Denial. Love, Justice and Service - answering the call. We learned more about the Order of Deaconess and Home Missioners administered by the United Methodist Women.

The stories of six women and their becoming deaconess were read and discussed. Their stories were so unique and different from one another. God calls people from all walks of life to do His work. Our scripture was 1 Corinthians 12:4-7 -- "There are a variety of gifts, a variety of service, variety of activities but the same God activates all of them in everyone." OUTREACH

Many thanks for all the support you give us. We can never thank you enough for all the support you give to us. Because of you we are able to continue our support of fifteen families through food delivery.

Here is what is coming up next.

<u>Food delivery</u> is the 2nd Friday each month. Feb. 11, 2022, at 11 AM in church fellowship area. We love to see new faces. If you cannot commit to every month, we would still encourage you to join us when you can. Once you learn the process, we could give our regulars a break (or cover them when they can't make it).

And just for your information, we recently did a report for the food bank and wanted to share with you the true magnitude of your work. These numbers represent our total efforts to help those in need in our community.

Collectively we serviced almost 5,000 families which represented 8,100 people Food Lion provide us almost 35 tons of surplus food plus an additional 3.25 tons of food in the holiday food boxes. The detailed breakdown is:

- Bakery 10,017 pounds
- Deli/Dairy 9,970 pounds
- Meat 17, 527 pounds
- Produce 32,449 pounds
- Holiday boxes 6,594 pounds

<u>Convicted Ministry</u> continues to support seven inmates. We could use help in getting cards to the inmates, our goal is to cover special occasions or even once a month. Tyler provided these names as they don't get mail often. You can help by signing the cards at the entrance on the table. If you could help us with the mailing process, we have labels and stamps, it would be a big help. Thank you.

<u>Prayer Grams</u> - You are doing a great job signing in each Sunday. If you have someone who needs a Prayer Gram, please provide us with their name and address.

Easter Food Baskets - Easter is April 17th this year, In mid-March we will have our list of items for this special meal which will include some Easter candy for the children (and grown- ups too).


